

Biodiversity Policy

Biological biodiversity is defined as "the variety of life forms, including, *inter alia*, terrestrial, marine and other aquatic ecosystems and the ecological complexes of which they are part"¹. Biodiversity is vital to maintaining a resilient natural environment and a resilient natural environment is vital to the sustainable development of Swire Pacific's businesses.

The executive management of each company in which Swire Pacific has a controlling interest will pay due regard to biodiversity considerations in its operations.

Associated and joint venture companies are encouraged to follow this policy.

Making it Happen:

It is the policy of Swire Pacific to:

- Ensure that all companies in which Swire Pacific has a controlling interest undertake biodiversity assessments where relevant to their operations.
- Minimise the adverse impact of its operations on biodiversity and ecosystems, including by protecting endangered species and promoting the sustainable use of natural resources important to biological diversity.
- Encourage its operating companies to support relevant and appropriate biodiversity and conservation initiatives and to participate in industry-specific working groups related to biodiversity and conservation.
- Promote awareness of biodiversity and conservation issues among our employees, customers, suppliers and others with whom we do business.
- Promote the restoration of ecosystems, where important to the areas in which our businesses operate.
