

Waste Management Policy

Swire Pacific is committed to responsible waste management to support the protection of natural resources and the health and wellbeing of the communities in which we operate.

This Policy applies to Swire Pacific Limited and its subsidiaries in a way that is relevant to their respective businesses. Associated and joint venture companies and those with whom we do business are encouraged to comply with it. Implementation of this Policy is the responsibility of the Management team of each group of operating companies.

POLICY

We expect all parties who are required and encouraged to follow this policy to meet or exceed all applicable regulations related to waste management.

Responsible waste management

- We shall divert waste from landfill in accordance with interim target and our long-term commitment to achieve zero waste to landfill by 2050;
- We shall minimise the environmental impact of waste produced through practices that follow the waste management hierarchy: avoid, redesign, reduce, reuse, recycle, energy recover, treatment and disposal;
- We shall ensure that hazardous and potentially hazardous waste is managed in an appropriate, responsible and transparent manner;
- We shall prevent the release of harmful waste substances into the air¹, water, and soil to minimise pollution and safeguard the environment, biodiversity, and human health.

Engagement and partnerships

- We should identify opportunities and engage partners and innovators to promote waste reduction, and to advance circular-economy practices;
- We should encourage suppliers and customers to adopt responsible and sustainable waste management practices.
